Technology has the most important part in our lives. We use it in our works in our study and many more. Some people would agree that technology reduce the children creativity, others would disagree.

Computers and other such devices we given to us for making our life easier, but too much dependency on such devices has brought us to present alarming situation.

Computers have been trained to paint pictures and compose music, but they have not yet mastered creative cognition—thinking divergently, going back and forth between conventional and unconventional thinking, making errors, and deciding on the best, most useful response, given a particular situation. However, with screens being a distractor, it takes away from their creativity and more kids playing less than the previous generation.

It is not mention often, but play has a huge role in imagination. "Play is a remarkably creative process that fosters emotional health, imagination, original thinking, problem solving, critical thinking, and self-regulation." Through playing, kids are able to create their own scenario, work through difficult times, built self confidence and feel a sense of mastery. If they play with materials, they are learning to understand concepts and skills that are the principles for later academic learning. By learning how to play, they are also learning how to learn such as asking question, creating and solving their own problems and taking initiative.
