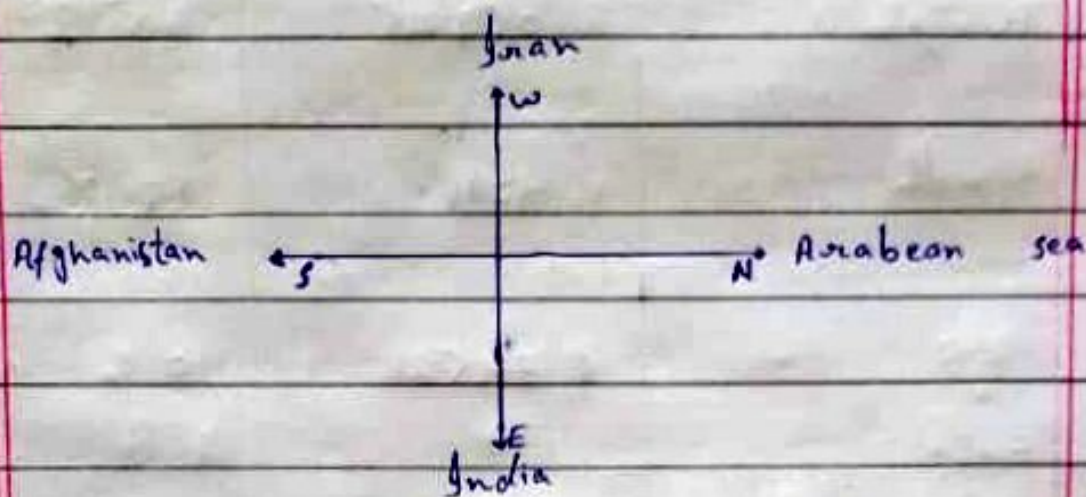

Ans:

Sir syed Ahmed Khan was born in delhi in 1817 in highly respectable family. He entered the service of east india company and rose to the position of judge in 1846.

⇒ During 1857 he served with loyalty and distinction. He was appointed chief justice in Muradabad and was later transferred to ghazipore in 1864. He was transferred to Aligarh where he played an important part in establishing the collage. Sir syed was interested in muslims. He wanted to improve relation with british and the position of muslims. The central aims of the Aligarh movement were to improve relation between british and muslims



communities by removing any British doubts about Muslims' loyalty and Muslim doubts about the British intentions.

### Aligarh movement.

Created a recognized identity of the Indian Muslims with the revival of the spirit of the Ummah.

Aligarh became the symbol of Muslim politics particularly after it was made the famous Aligarh Muslim University. Undoubtedly Aligarh created a nation as it can not be denied that the Pakistan idea is the outcome of Aligarh movement improve the social and economic position of Muslims by encouraging them to receive western education and take up post in the civil service and army.
