Create spirit of sharing.

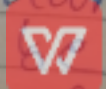

Introduction to hajj

Once a year, Muslims of every ethnic group, colour, social status, and culture gather together in Mecca and stand before the Kaaba praising Allah together



- It is a ritual that is designed to promote the bonds of Islamic brotherhood and sisterhood by showing that everyone is equal in the eyes of Allah.



- The Hajj makes Muslims feel real importance of life here on earth, and the afterlife, by stripping away all markers of social status, wealth, and pride. In the Hajj all are truly equal.



- The Hajjis or pilgrims wear simple white clothes called Ihram. During the Hajj the Pilgrims perform acts of worship and they renew their sense of purpose in the world.



- Mecca is a place that is holy to all Muslims. It is so holy that no non Muslim is allowed to enter.
- For Muslims, the Hajj is the fifth and final pillar of Islam. It occurs in the month of Dhul Hijjah which is the twelfth month of the Islamic lunar calendar. It is the journey that every sane adult Muslim must undertake at least once in their lives if they can afford it and are physically able



BENEFITS OF HAJJ

- Hajj is the largest annual gathering of people anywhere in the world. People of all colors, backgrounds and wealth come together as equals in front of their creator. Once you're there, there is no white, brown, or black; there's no rich or poor there's only Muslim. Everyone wears the same ihram to signify that no one is better than his Muslim brother. This creates unity among the Muslims of the world, it fosters brotherhood and love for the sake of Allah



Spiritual benefits of hajj

Tawhid

- The concept of tawhid excludes man's commitment to anyone other than Allah. Also a rejection of all sources of value other than will of Allah.
- authority but His, and a refusal to accept any idea, command, or injunction from
- anyone as man does from Allah on the basis of its having not come from
- Him. Love or reverence, worship or submission, and a sense of obligation, all are
- directed towards Allah (SWT) alone and no one else deserves them in the ultimate,
- full sense of these attitudes. In the human context it means emancipation



Introduction of tawhid

- The Islamic worldview is based on two primary source the Qurān and the Sunnah,
- which incorporates the tradition concerning the life example of Prophet Muhammad
- (SAW). However, the nucleus of both is the principle of tawhid which provides
- motivation to all that there is in Islamic thought.



- It is associated with the concept of
- din, which is translated in modern times as “religion” but has a broader sense of
- including creed, normative standards, and the whole range of standard behaviour. The
- Qur’ān affirms that with God, the din is al-Islam which can be translated more
- generally as stating with God the true way is submission or more specifically



Concept of tawhid

- The concept of tawhid encapsulates the Islamic world-view. It is the basis of Islamic
- culture and civilization. Knowledge, social action and social organizations in Islam
- are based on the world-view defined by tawhid. Tawhid defines the relation between
- the human and the creator as well the relationships among the various creations in the
- universe. The One God, known by His Arabic name Allah is the core of Islam



Tawhid in the light of islam

- Allah sent his Messenger (SAW) to call people to the tawhid and to forbid them
- from committing shirk. Prophet (SAW) performed this in the best possible manner and
- suffered a lot for the sake of Allah . In the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (SAW)
- faith in One God is the most important and fundamental principle. It is the bedrock of
- Islam and the mainspring of its power. All other beliefs, commands and laws of Islam
- stand firm on this foundation as mentioned in numerous Hadith of Prophet (SAW). It
- is narrated by Ibn Abbas (RA) When the Prophet (SAW) sent Mu'adh to Yemen, he



Risalah prophethood

- **Risalah, meaning prophethood or the belief in prophets, is a basic of faith for Muslims.**



- Prophets are messengers sent from God, or Allah, to help Muslims follow the straight path. Although the names of many prophets are recorded in the Quran, the Quran records the names of twenty-five prophets.



- However, there are only a select few who are considered to be true prophets according to Islam Allah the Creator of the universe and everything in it, created humans for a noble purpose: to worship Him alone and lead a virtuous life based on His teachings and guidance.



- Allah appointed certain individuals to communicate and demonstrate His message to all of mankind. These individuals are known as Prophets, which include Adam, Noah, Abraham, Moses, Jesus and Muhammad – may peace be upon them all.



The Characteristics of Prophets

- The main difference between an ordinary human being and a Prophet is that a Prophet receives revelation from Allah.



Prophets have noble character

- Prophets never sought personal benefits such as wealth, high status or power – rather, they only sought the approval of God.



- Prophets were the best examples amongst their people in character and righteousness. They lived in obedience to God, with excellent morals and were always truthful in speech and conduct. For this reason, Muslims reject totally the false attribution of major sins to the Prophets, as appears in some scriptures of other religions.



Prophets perform miracles

- Many Prophets performed miracles, usually in a field which their people excelled. For example, the people of Moses (peace be upon him) excelled in magic therefore, Moses (peace be upon him) was able to perform miraculous acts which even magicians could not perform.



Prophets are not divine

- While Prophets are chosen by Allah Almighty, they are in no way divine and should not be worshipped. Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was commanded to say, "I am only a man like you. It has been revealed to me that your God is One God"



The Final Prophet

- Prophets were sent to specific groups of people, and over time, the messages with which they came were lost or corrupted. However, Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) was not sent to a specific people, but to mankind as a whole, and his message has been preserved both in the form of the Quran and the Sunnah. Since the Quran and Sunnah are preserved



- As we know that prophet Muhammad peace be upon him is our last messenger
- After him no will come or the or the prophesy is to the end so we will not believe on someone or not call someone as prophet he is our last and final prophet we will obey him so can succeed in life
