### Question no 1:-

What is the meaning of Zakat? and explain its objectives.

### Answer:-

#### Zakat:-

The charity holds a great place in Islam, therefore, it is made an obligation on Muslims in the form of Zakat.

#### Major five pillars:-

Zakat is one of the major five pillars of Islam. It is necessary to give Zakat to those



who are wealthy enough.

## Meaning of Zakat:-

⇒ Zakat have two meanings. Zakat means to "Purify". It refers to the purification of a Muslim's wealth and soul. Wealth purification denotes the mobilization of assets for the purpose of financial growth and justified distribution.

⇒ Purification of the soul implies freedom from hatred, ~~jealousy~~ jealousy, selfishness, uneasiness and greed.

⇒ Zakat also means "to remove impediments and help in growth and development."



## Objectives of Zakat:-

- To control concentration of wealth.

"In order that wealth may not become a fortune used by the rich among you".

- To reduce poverty.

"The Quran states:  
"And in their wealth there is recognized right of the beggars and deprived off."

- To purify the wealth of a person.

"Take Zakat from their wealth in order to purify them and sanctify them."



## Question no 2:-

What prime categories of prayers and what is the difference between nafl and wajib prayer?

## Answer:-

### ∴ Prayer:-

⇒ In Islam, prayer, supplication, purification and most ritual actions are considered acts of worship (ibadat).

⇒ Islamic prayer (Salah / Namaz) is considered as a complete form of worship.

⇒ Prayer is a religious service, especially a regular one, at which people gather in order to pray together.



⇒ Prayer is a second pillar of Islam. It is performed five times a day and oriented toward Mecca.

### ∴ Prime Categories of prayer:-

- Fard prayer.
- Wajib prayer.
- Sunnah prayer.
- Nafil prayer.

### \* Difference between nafil and wajib prayer:-

#### ∴ Wajib prayer:-

Arabic word with which is also known as wajib prayer is an



Islamic prayer that is performed at night after isha or before fajr. According to the Hanafi fiqh, witr prayer is wajib. The status of wajib is very close to that of fard, and it is the huge difference from nafl prayer.

### ∴ Nafl prayer:-

A nafl prayer is a type of optional Muslim Salah. As with Sunnah prayer, they are not considered obligatory but are thought to confer extra benefit on the person performing them. Example is the offering of 4 "nafl" rakats before the compulsory dhuh prayer.



## Question no 3:-

Write any five signs before the day of judgment.

## Answer:-

### ∴ The day of judgment:-

⇒ The day of judgment is also known as the day of Reckoning, the last day, and the hour.

⇒ Muslims believe that at the end of time, all human beings will have to face God and account for their deeds, good and bad. The time of the day of judgment is not specified in the Quran but is understood to be near. As Islam told him some signs of the day of judgment.



## Five Signs of the day of Judgment

There are many signs of the day of judgment but the five are as below:

### ∴ The arrival of Imam Mehdi-

Prophet (saww) said,  
'One of my descendants created by Allah will come prior to the end of the world. His name will be the same as mine and his father name will be the same as my father.'

### ∴ Dajjal will Come:

The most obvious and common signs that most people are told is the arrival of Dajjal. When he will arrive, he will proclaim



himself as God.

## ∴ The Descent of Jesus :-

When Dajjal has arrived and he is claiming to be God, the descent of Prophet Jesus will happen. He would then fight with Dajjal and kill him.

## ∴ The Emergence of Yajooj and Majooj :-

There are many references to the emergence of Yajooj and Majooj. They are locked inside a wall. On doomsday they will be able to break the wall and come after the people. Hazrat Issa will appear on the Earth and save people from their wrath and danger.



## ∴ The Smoke will Appear:-

According to Hadith
