

Q1: What is the role of institutions in society – do they perform positive functions, or simply work in the interests of the powerful and against the powerless?

ANS: - Institutions are a part of the social order of **society** and they govern behaviour and expectations of individuals, while at the same time they regulate business operations and ethics. In fact, the morality of **institutions** is guaranteed by the process of social evolution.

POSITIVE FUNCTIONS:

Institution in a society have a positive impact for powerless people. Institution fulfill their basic needs like education, health problems, foods etc. so the institution in a society are also working for powerless peoples present in society

Q2: Beggarization or Beggary is as an Organized Crime in Pakistan, what are its causes and suggest how to stop beggary?

ANS: - Beggary is a dynamic, complex, multi-faceted phenomena, and its nature and extent has evolved over time into a loose network of organized crime.
