Q1) WHAT IS MEANT BY TAWHID IN ISLAM?

It is true that monotheism (monotheism mean Muslims believe in only one God, Allah) is the oneness of God alone, but at the same time it is something that is so clearly defined in our religion, that it is a lifelong quest for knowledge. Tawhid means unity. But in Islamic terms, it refers to Allah which is special to him. The antithesis of monotheism is 'shirk' which is a partnership with Allah which is one's own, by giving to others.

(God is witness that there is no god but He, and so are the angels and the people of knowledge. That He upholds the creatures with justice. There is no god but Him, the Mighty, the Wise.)

Islam is an Arabic word derived from the word 'salm' which means peace and 'silm' which means to submit one's will to Allah. Islam believes in Tawhid, which is not just monotheism, that is, belief in a unique God, but much more. Tawhid literally means "unity" and is derived from the Arabic verb "unity" which means united, unification or stability. Tawhid can be divided into three groups.

(A) Tawhid ar-Ruboobeeyah (maintaining the unity of Lordship).

(B) Tawhid al-Asmaa was sifaat (maintaining the unity of Allah's name and attributes).

(C) Tawhid al-Ibaadah (maintaining the unity of worship)

Q2) WHAT ARE THE FOUR BOOKS THAT ALLAH SENT DOWN?

Allah have sent down 4 Books. The Towrat which he revealed to Mosa aliesalam, The Zabur Which he revealed to Dawood aliesalam The Injeel to Isa aliesalam and Quran kareem the final revelation to prophet Muhammad (S,A,W)

Q3) IN WHICH AGE CHILDREN ARE OUGHT TO BE LEARNT PRAYER?

The reason for this is the hadith of the Messenger of Allah.

"You order children to pray at the age of seven, and punish them when they reach ten."

(Teach a child to pray at the age of seven, and punish him for refusing at the age of ten.)

After reaching the age of seven, parents are obliged to command their children, regardless of their gender, male or female, from the moment they are born (the age at which a child can distinguish between right and wrong). Yes, it can make a difference between a man and a woman (what to eat and what to get), so that they can offer prayers with all the required conditions, whether it is punctuality or mosque prayers. If there are no parents, the responsibility rests with the grandparents on the part of the parent or mother and the relative who is available. And if there is neither one nor the other, the responsibility of ordering the prayers is given to the child's guardian. If necessary, they order the children to pray and even warn them that if they leave it, they will be punished.
