(5) Al-Quran:-

Al-Quran is the holy book for Muslims. It is miraculous word of Allah revealed to Prophet. Therefore, Al-Quran is a wahy or divine revelation that has reached us through or a holy connection starting from Allah to the angel Jibreel to the Prophet Muhammad.

(6) Revealed Al-Quran:- Many year latter Allah revealed Al-Quran to prophet Muhammad the prophet was 40 years old when the Quran began to revealed to him and he was 63 when the revelation was completed.

(7) The revelation of Al-Quran:-
 The revelation of Al-Quran started in the month of Ramadan during the year 610 AD at that time prophet Muhammad was in a cave called Ghar Hira on the Jabal-un-Noor or the mountain of light near Makkah. Jibreel RA continued to teach prophet Muhammad passages of Al-Quran every now and then. The revelation continued throughout the following 23 years of the life of Rasoolullah until he passed away.

(8) The Quran is for all times, all conditions and all mankind:-

⇒ It contains a complete code which provides for all areas of life. It is a code which has no boundaries of time, place or nation. It will remain the same for all times to come as Allah has taken upon Himself the duty of guarding it.

⇒ In the Quran there are also reminders of Allah Favours on his Creation mild but firm warnings and rebukes. There are also stories of the past, followed by lessons to be learned from their fate.
