

Q:1:- Write a detail note on Holy Book Quran?

Answer:- AL-Quran is the Holy book for Muslims. It is miraculous word of Allah revealed to Prophet Muhammad (SAW) through angel Jibreel.

Therefore, AL-Quran is a wahy or divine revelation that has reached us through or a holy connection starting from Allah to the angel Jibreel to the Prophet Muhammad. The Wahy or Quranic ~~text~~ revelation is regarded by Muslims as the exact word of Allah.

Many years later Allah revealed AL-Quran to Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), the Prophet (SAW) was 40 years old when the Quran began to be revealed to him and he was 63 years when the revelation was completed.

⇒ The Revelation of AL-Quran:-

The revelation of AL-Quran started in the month of Ramadan during the year 610 AD at that time Prophet Muhammad (SAW) was in a cave called Ghār Hira on the Jabal-un-Noor or the mountain of light near Makkah Jibreel continued to teach Prophet Muhammad (SAW) passages of AL-Quran every now and then, the revelation continued throughout the

following 23 years of the life of Rasoolullah until he passed away at that point revelation of Al-Quran was completed.

⇒ Structure of Al-Quran :-

The Quran is made of 114 suras (chapters). Each Surah of Al-Quran made of few or many Ayaat, or verses. The longest Surah in Al-Quran has 286 Ayaat / verses while the shortest surah has only three Ayaat / verses. The name of longest surah is surah "Al-Baqara" and the shortest is Surah-ul-Kawthar. The rest of Suras has different numbers of Ayaat that fall in between. Like the Suras have different length, the Ayaat have different lengths too.

There are 30 parts, each juzu' has number of suras. The great scholars of Islam divided the Quran into 30 equal parts. This way its easier for us to read in one month as the Prophet recommended us to do.

⇒ Theme of Holy Quran :-

The theme of the Holy Quran consists broadly of three fundamental beliefs. They are:

- 1) Tawhid - Allah and Predestination
- 2) Risalah - Angels of Allah, Books of Allah and messengers of Allah.
- 3) Akhirah - Life after Death and the Day of Judgement.





Q: 2:- Write a ~~detail~~ down the explanation of Surah-e-Quraish?

Answer:- Surah Quraish:-

The word Quraish means "one who collect" or "one who searches".

Surah Quraish is the 108th chapter of the Quran. It consist of 4 ayaat / verses. The surrah was titled after the word "Quraysh" in the first verse. This surrah was revealed in Mecca. It has a 17 words and 73 letters.

⇒ Summary:-

It urges the Quraish tribe who dominated Mecca to serve God, who had protected them, for the sake of their own future. It is one of two suras containing 4 ayaat / verses, the other is "Al-Ikhlās". It form a pair with the preceding sura, Al-Fil, reminding the Quraish of the favors that Allah had bestowed upon them.

⇒ The Kaba was central to the life of the Quraish, being a center of pilgrimage which brought much trade and prestige. Surah al-Fil describes how God saved the Kaba from destruction while Surah Quraish describes God as Lord of the Kaba. It also urges the Quraish to worship God so that, among other things, he would protect them on their trading journeys.



Q: 3:- According to Qur'an what is Tawheed and how to effect on human lives?

Answer:-

Tawheed mean "Oneness of Allah"

⇒ ~~Effect~~ Tawheed :- means streering the concept of unity or oneness of Allah. Based on the concept of tawheed, Muslims have faith in that God cannot be held equal in any way or grade to any other being or concept, He is only One and deserve to be worshiped.

⇒ Effect of Tawheed on Human Life:-

An unshakeable belief in the One-ness or Unity of Allah has a marvelous effect on the life of human beings. Man must have full belief that Allah is the Supreme Being to whom he owes supplication and worship. He should prostrate before Allah only and keep away from lifeless man-made idols of stone and wood.

⇒ Self Respect:-

A person who believe in the Sovereignty of Allah does not fear any one but Allah. A despotic ruler, a hard task-master, an ofer of an illegitimate money or office, or any other cruel and un social suffering cannot deter him from the right path, since he seeks help from the Great Lord of Heavens to whom only he bows down to seek His help.



Thus his sense of self respect is strengthened and his character rises high.

⇒ Humanity :-

The conduct of a true Muslim is regulated by his firm belief in Tauheed. He cultivates humility and forbearances, since he knows that he is helpless before Allah; whatever he possesses belong to Allah. "Allah who is the Giver is also the Taker"; so a person has no ground for being proud or haughty and he should be submissive and follow the course of humility.

⇒ Boldness and Perseverance :-

Muslim has complete faith in One Allah, he is afraid of Him and Him alone; he does not fear anyone else; he does not bend his head even before the mightiest person. He becomes a symbol of bravery and boldness; he cultivates the habit of facing all the odds with perseverance and courage, as stated about the true Muslims in the Holy Quran:

وَلَا خَوْفٌ عَلَيْهِمْ وَلَا هُمْ يَحْزَنُونَ ۝

"They are neither afraid nor grieved". (Al-Baqarah: 62)
