Prayer :-

In Islam, prayer, supplication, purification and most ritual actions are considered acts of worship (ibadat). The most well-known, and an obligatory act in Islam is the performance of the five times prayer.

In Arabic it is known as Salah (often written salat).

Fard :-

⇒ If someone missed a fard prayer their is no forgiveness it should be performed later but it must be performed.

⇒ To perform fard prayers in congregation is most valuable than praying alone in home.

Nafil :-

= One can offer nafil prayers depending on them

Sunnah:

- = Sunnah Prayers are those that our prophet performed regularly other than the obligatory.
- = Allah did not command to perform these prayers.

Wajib:

- => This is also an obligatory prayer.
- => The witr prayer (offered during the isha prayer) is a wajib prayer.
- => It has lesser importance than the fard prayer.
