Question No. 1 (a) Difference between research and search:

The systematic investigative process that revise and increase the study and knowledge about a topic by scientific observation and experimentations is called research. More precisely we may differentiate the research and search as "research is the process of searching again and again in a systematic way by using specific methodology and utilizing the physical as well as the mental skills" according to the Advanced learner's dictionary of current English lays down the meaning of research as "a carful investigation or inquiry especially thorough search for new facts in any branch of education".

The literal meaning of research is *meticulous search*. If you simply 'search', you will find something. However, if you conduct 'research' you will be able to answer a particular question, solve a problem, or gather information, especially for a project, literary work, cinema, or a television series. This is the popular concept of research.

In academic fields, the term 'research' is used to denote activities such as defining, redefining, and solving problems; observing facts and their interpretation; formulation of hypotheses and their testing through experiments; revision of existing theories and laws; and practical application of information already generated. In most scientific disciplines, research is used as a tool to understand and solve problems for the benefit of people.

Decision As a Mayor:

After the consideration of the above expected reasons as a Mayor I have to take the following steps but on the basis of availability of budget.

- 1. <u>Hiring of Manpower:</u> In underdeveloped areas such as old and congested, old populations areas I have to increase the Captains and constables.
- 2. <u>Hiring of Technologies:</u> In developed areas of cities such as Hayatabad, well developed societies where continuous supply of electricity can be maintained I will install a network of CCTV and intruders along the boundary walls. Recordings & display will be observed at Centralized control centre.
- 3. <u>Vigilance on the criminals</u>: Continuous monitoring of those criminals which are punished in any case, there hideouts, there relations and the suspected ones will be recorded & updated.
