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DISCUS Sir Syed Ahmad Khan's Educational and Political Services for the muslim.

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan Educational Service:

Sir Syed Ahmed Khan was the first Muslim leader who realised the importance of education for his people. In the order of equip the muslim with the ornament of knowledge he opened the following the educational insititutions and Societie which revolutioned the life of the muslim of Community.

- (a) Two madrasas in Muradabad (1858) and Ghaziabad (1862) which imparted education in Persian.
- (b) In 1864, Sir Syed Ahmad Khan laid the foundation of Scientific Society which translated English works into Urdu.
- (c) M.A.O High School was founded in 1875.
- (d) In 1877, M.A.O High School was given the status of college and inaugurated by Viceroy Lord Lytton, later on this college became a university in 1920 A.D.

- ① Educational backwards of Muslims.
- ② Economic distress of Muslim community.
- ③ Need for better of social status.
- ④ Need for friendly relations with British rules.

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan Political Services :-

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan rendered meritorious political service in order to defend the rights of the Muslims. His services were as under.

(A) After the war of independence 1857,

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan compiled a pamphlet entitled *Rasala-i-Ashab-e-Baghawat-i-Hindu* in which he explained to the British that the Muslims were not the only force behind the catastrophe of 1857.

He enlisted the following factors which led to the uprising

(a) Misunderstanding of the people about the rules.

(b) Malad ministry by the army.

(c) Promulgation of regulations which were contrary to the wishes of people.

(A) Sir Syed Ahmad Khan wrote a commentary on William Hunter's book.

(B) Sir Syed Ahmad Khan founded a Patriotic Association in order to counter the anti-Muslim propaganda by the Hindus.

Q2:- Explain First Political and Constitutional phase from 1947 to 1958.

1st Phase 1947 to 1958:-

After the partition of India on the mid night of 14 and 15 August, 1947 Pakistan followed the British system by creating the post of prime minister:

Based at the prime minister Secretaryate the Governor General of Pakistan Quaid-e-Azam appointed Liaquat Ali Khan

to established and lead his administration on 15 August 1947. Before the present system in 1960, '7' prime minister had served between 1947 until martial law in 1958 by Ayub Khan.
