Mobile Journalism

Definition:

To begin with, it is smart phone used for reporting purposes. It is also known as mojo, mobile journalism or smart phone journalism. It is a form of rocketing new media story telling, where journalists use mobile phones with network connectivity to gather, edit and distribute news.

Such reporters are known as mojos, mobile journalist or freelance journalists.

History :

Moreover, it must not be forgotten that the speed which mobile phone is improving is incredible.


Nit only all the phones improving but, with the passage of time APPs are getting better too.

Senate :

It consists of 104 members overall

None Linear Editor :

It is a type of editing either for photo, video or audio. It is Digital editing as simple as that and today where technology is on the peak it is on the peak it is more used. In fact mostly used form of editing.

It is a method that allows you to access any frame in a digital video clip regardless of sequence in the clip. The freedom to access any frame, and use a cut-and-paste method, similar to the ease of cutting and pasting text in a word processor, and allows you to easily include fades, transitions, and other effects that cannot be achieved with linear editing.



Nowadays, the world it is editing anything anytime ones to do. It is more flexible. Linear editing was something that comes first with having no time of seconds chance and one had to do everything all over again.

For instance let me explain with the example of footage in a none-linear editing. If ones it started working on it or record it, you bring it on a digital file and put that file into premiere Pro, Final cut or some other software and if you feel like the colors not what you wanted so you put on colors or add some curves depending on the choice. Yet, the actual original file can be saved in the system which is un touched. It does nothing to the original and also again, even inside the edited footage if you want to change or redo anything it is possible. It is a kind of non destructive work.

Supreme Court of Pakistan :

Supreme Court is the most powerful one and the judge there is known as chief Justice and there are other judges there too. Besides chief justice the other judges are 15 in number.

To be a judge in supreme court of Pakistan it is important to have Pakistani identity and having a work experience as judge minim 5 years in any court and working experience of a minimum 15 years in high court.

The retirement age of this judge is 65 years.

The first chief justice of Pakistan's supreme court was Abdul Rasheed.

Structure :

On the top lies supreme Court of Pakistan. Beneath thus, there is a court knows as Fedral Sharyat court.

And there are high courts under supreme court. There are 4 districts across the country and each district has a high court in Pakistan and one is in the capital so it is total 6 in number.

There are the following High courts across the country:

- 1. Baluchistan High Court
- 2. Islamabad High Court
- 3. Lahore High Court
- 4. Peshawar High Court
- 5. Sindh High Court
- 6. District and session Court

Beneath High court there is district session judge. Every area (zila) has it's own District session judge and additional District session Judge. In Cities and districts there are magistrates and seniors civil judges.

There are rules and regulations when it comes to the selection of judges across the country. It requires experience.

The retirement age of high court judges is 62 years.

Under the courts mentioned above comes the trial cpurts and under this is the special courts also known as bench courts.



Court Reporting :

A court reporter, formerly referred to as a law reporter, is a journalist whose job is to capture the live trials going on in the courts. These are the reporters having the beat to cover the courts.

In order to be a court reporter is must to know about the courts have the basic information.

To put in a nutshell, these reporters cover court and transfer the news to people by the help of media.

These reporters need to understand different court terminologies regarding courts.
