- * The reward for praying fard prayers in congregation is more than praying alone.

* Najib Prayer:-

- * This is also an obligatory prayer.
- * It has lesser importance than the fard prayer.
- * The witr prayer (offered during the isha prayer) is a Najib prayer.

* Nafl Prayer:-

- * These prayers are optional or voluntary prayers.
- * One can offer nafl prayers depending on one's will.

* Sunnah Prayer:-

- * It was the practise of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW)
- * Allah did not command to perform these prayers.

Tawhid:-

Tawhid is the most important Islamic belief.

It means the Oneness or Uniqueness of Allah.

* Technical Meaning Of Tawhid:-

Allah is one in his being & attributes and he is the only one who is worthy to be worshipped & obeyed.

* Prophethood In Islam:-

Risalah, meaning prophethood or the belief in prophets, is a basic article of faith for Muslims. Prophets are messengers sent from God, or Allah, to help Muslims follow the straight path.

It is believed that Muhammad received the "Quran", which is the most important Islamic holy book and the only one to contain the pure word of Allah.

At the age of 40 in 610, CE, Muhammad is said to have received his first verbal revelation in the cave called Hira, which was the beginning of the descent of the Quran that continued up to the end of his life, and Muslims hold that Muhammad was asked by God to preach the oneness of God in order to stamp out idolatry.
