it became the cores of the freedom movement and the basis of Pakistan

What is ideology:

The word "ideology" is composed of two Greek words 'idea' and 'logos' it literally means the science or study of idea.

The ideology of any nation reflects the ideals and aspirations of its people, and religion and cultural shape

Ideology of Pakistan

Two nation Theory:-

Two nation theory is basically the clear separation between the two nations living in the Indo-pak called Hindu and Muslim. According to this theory Muslim and Hindu are two separate nations from every definition. Therefore muslim should have a separate homeland in the muslims majority areas of India. where they can spend their lives according to the glorious Teaching of Islam.

Two nations theory in its simplest way means that Cultural, political, religious economic and social dissimilarities between the two major communities

The two nation theory was a founding principle of the Pakistan movement and the partition of India in 1947

The ideology that religion is determining factor in defining the nationality of India muslim and Hindus was postulated by Muhammad Ali Jinnah who termed it as the awakening of muslim for

Democracy: Democracy is the form of the govt in which all eligible citizens have an equal say in the decision that affect their lives. democracy allows peoples to participate equally either directly or through elected representatives in the proposal, Development and Creation of Laws. it encompasses social, economic and Cultural conditions that enable the free and equal practice of political self determination. the term originates from Greek words "demokratia" which translate to "rule of the people". This terms was used around 400 BCE to denote the political system then existing in Greek city states notably athens

The British ruler accepted the reality
that Muslims and Hindu are
separate from each other and
they can't be able to live
together. That's why both of the
nation were given free on
Aug, 1947 - which is the real
proof of two nation theory.
