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(Q No) what is meaning of Zakat and Enplane its objective?

Ans ZAKAT

Zakat is one of the five pillars of Islam. It has been mentioned along with daily prayers (Salaat Namaz) over seventy times in the Quran. Allah's word commanding and establish regular Salaat and give regular Zakat are referred to in many parts of the Quran. From this we can conclude that after Salaat, Zakat is the most important act in Islam. Just as Salaat is the most important acts of worship which has to be performed monetarily. Those who fulfill this duty have been promised abundant reward in this world and hereafter. Whoever evades Zakat has been sternly warned in the

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Quran and Hadith of the
Consequences.

Linguistically, Zakat has two
meanings: purification and growth.
Technically it means to purify
one's possession of wealth by
distributing a prescribed amount
to the poor, indigent, the
slaves or captives, and the
wayfarer.

Zakat is obligatory upon a
person if:

1. He or she is an adult, sane,
free and muslim.

2. He or she must possess wealth
in excess of specified minimum
(Nisab) excluding his or her
personal needs (clothing household
furniture, utensils, cars - etc,
are termed article of personal
needs).

3. It should be possessed for a
complete lunar year.

4. It should be of productive nature
from which one can derive
profit or benefit such as
merchandise for business, gold,
silver, livestock etc.

The amount of wealth which makes one liable for Zakat is called Nisab. The Nisab as fixed by prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H) is as follow

Gold: 7.50 tola
Silver: 52.50 tola

Objectives of Zakat:

- ⇒ Establish a welfare system in the society
- ⇒ Ensure circulation of wealth
- ⇒ Create spirit of sharing
- ⇒ Reduce love for wealth
- ⇒ Generate harmonious love in the community

PRAYER

Prayer is the religious service especially a regular one, at which people gather on order to pray together. Prayer (Salah) is the second pillar of Islam it is a

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prescribed liturgy performed five times a day (preferably in a mosque) and oriented toward Mecca.

(Prime Categories of prayer)

- 1) fard prayer
- 2) wajib prayer
- 3) sunnah prayer
- 4) nafil prayer

2) NAFIL prayer)

→ nafil prayers are optional or voluntary prayers.

→ one can offer nafil prayers depending on one's will.

(2) WAJIB prayer)

→ This is also an obligatory prayer.

→ It has lesser importance than the fard prayer.

→ The witr prayer (offered during the Isha prayer).

- > Hajj is the fifth basic duty of Islam
- > Hajj is a visit to the Kabah in Makkah during the 12th month of the Islamic calendar - Dhul Hijjah.
- > Hajj is an act of worship to please Allah
- > A muslim tries to make pilgrimage at least once in a lifetime

- > Total forgiveness for past sins.

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Background to Hajj

Adam and Eve

(TAWHID)

Tawheed is the indivisible oneness of concept of monotheism in Islam. Tawhid is the religion central and single most important concept upon which a muslim entire faith rests.

→ Tawhid constitutes the foremost articles of the muslim profession of faith. The first part of the shahada (the Islamic declaration of faith) is the declaration of belief in the oneness of God. muslim believe that the entirety of the Islamic teaching rest on the principle of tawheed.

→ from an Islamic standpoint there is an uncompromising monotheism at the heart of the Islamic beliefs (aqidah) which is seen as distinguishing Islam from other major religions. moreover, tawheed requires muslims not only to avoid worshiping multiple gods, but also to ~~be~~ relinquish

Striving for money, social status or egoism.

(prophethood on Islam)

prophethood is a key belief in Islam. it is based around the fact that Allah has sent a series of messengers to give humankind guidance on how to follow the straight path.

→ Risalah, meaning prophethood or the belief in prophet, is a basic article of faith for Muslims.

→ prophets are messengers sent from God, or Allah to help Muslims follow the straight path. Although the names of many prophets are recorded in both the Bible and the Quran, recorded the name of twenty five prophets.

→ However, there are only a select few who are considered to be true prophets according to Islam. They are

- (1) Adam (2) Abraham and Isaac (also known as Ibrahim and Ishmael)
- (3) Isa (4) Prophet Muhammad.
