Quran :- The word "Quran" mean "The Book being read repeatedly"
Quran is the holy book for Muslims.
The Holy book revealed to Prophet Muhammad (S.A.W.). The Prophet was 40 years old when Quran began to revealed to him and he was 63 when the revelation was completed.

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Revelation:-

The period of revelation of the Quran is 22 years, 5 months and 14 days. The period of revelation in Mecca was 13 years. The period of revelation in Medina was 10 years.

Quran content is concerned with basic Islamic beliefs including the existence of God and resurrection. Narratives of the early prophets, ethical and legal subjects, historical events of Muhammad's time, charity and prayer also appear in the Quran.

Surah e Quraish :-

Chapter Number :- 106

Revelation Period :- Makkah (610-615 AD)

Quraish :- (An Adab Taibe)

Translation :-

- 1 For the accustomed security of the Quraish
- 2 Their accustomed security to the Journeys in the winter and the Summer.
- 3 So they should worship the Lord of this house.
- 4 Who has fed them against hunger and made them secure from fear.

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Theme of Surah Quraish:-

Allah reminds the Quraishites of the grace He bestowed upon the land; safety, growing businesses, and the respect others gave them for living in Allah's Sanctuary. He ~~reminded~~ reminds the Quraishites so that they might be ashamed of associating others with him in worship.

Explanation:-

This surah gives a brief account of God's Blessings on the tribe of Quraish where Muhammad (S.A.W) born. It was the ruling tribe of Mecca. They were the custodians of the Kaaba, and their primary.

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Profession was trading, but the most significant gift was Kaaba, the House of the Lord, people from all over the world would come to visit it. Quraish had a lot of respect, prominence & power at that time. Also, it is a source of significant income through pilgrims. It has also been said that the meaning (البيت) is what Quraish would gather during their winter & summer journeys to Yemen & Syria respectively and return to their city in safety due to the respect that the people had for them because they were the residents of Allah's sanctuary.

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Q³ According to Quran what is tawheed and how to effect on human lives?

Tawheed :- One-ness of God is the pivot around which the whole system of Islam revolves. It's a muslim strong belief that Allah is one and there is no God but Allah. In case a person does not firmly believe in tawheed, he has a basic defect in his faith of Islam, which amounts to his belongings to the ranks of non-muslims. All the religions of the world have always affirmed that Allah is one. Tawheed is the religion's central and single most important concept.

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Importance of Tawheed:

Tawheed or the oneness of God, is an important teaching with regards to beliefs about not worshipping idols. Since they might believe so strongly in the oneness of God, they will also think that Allah is just and merciful so will allow all Muslims who have followed his ways to Jannah.

Tawheed & Quran:

Some of the verses of the holy Quran, preaching the creed of the One-ness of Allah:

An surah Alkhlaf: (translation)

"Say, He is Allah, the One. Allah the eternally Besought of all: He begetteth not nor was

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he be-gotten. And there is none comparable unto him."

Tauheed on Human Life.

Man must have full belief that Allah is the Supreme Being to whom he owes supplication & worship.

How is the character of conduct of a Muslim affected by Tauheed? Here are few suggestions.

Humanity:-

The conduct of a true Muslim is regulated by his firm belief in tauheed. He cultivates humility and forbearance, since he knows that he is helpless before Allah. whatever he possesses belong to Allah.

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Self-respect:-

A person who believes in the sovereignty of Allah does not fear any one but Allah. A hard task master, a despotic ruler, an officer of an illegitimate money or office, or any other cruel and un-social suffering can not deter him from the right path.

Goodmindedness:-

A person who believes in the Oneness of God is fully aware of the fact that Allah is the Creator of everything in the world; He is the sustainer of all; He bestows His blessings on His creatures at all times.
