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# **PLAGIARISM:**

## **Plagiarism**

### **situations:**

- your friend had your current English teacher last year. she gives you one of her essays that received a

"B+". you make a few changes and submit it.

- you find an article on the internet that says exactly what you would like to say in your essay. you copy a few sentences and forgot to add a citation.

# **key to Avoiding** **plagiarism:**

## **Golden rule:**

- Always write a source citation for words and ideas that are not your own.
- Always include that source on your references page.

## **EXAMPLE:**

**original source**

On film or videotape, violence begins and ends in a moment. "Bang bang, you're dead." Then the death is over. This sense of action-without-consequences replicates and reinforces the dangerous "magical" way many children think. Do the twelve- and fourteen-year-olds who are shooting each other to death in Los Angeles, Chicago or Washington, D.C., really understand that death is permanent, unalterable, final, tragic? Television certainly is not telling them so.

## **EXAMPLE: Plagiarism**

### **Plagiarism**

# PARAPHRASE:

Using some of your own words to express another writer's ideas.

# VERBATIMS:

copying another writer's word exactly as printed with no changes.
