Ans): Essay on BRT

BRT is a bus rapid transit system in Peshawar, capital of Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) province. BRT system consists of two parts: the first encompasses an east-west corridor served by 32 stations on a dedicated lane for exclusive use by buses, while the second part consists of a network of feeder routes in which buses can enter and exit the system to travel on city streets. Construction of the project, under the Peshawar Development Authority (PDA) began in 2017, and was executed by the Peshawar Development Authority. The system was inaugurated in August 2020.

Peshawar's first phase consists of an east-west busway which stretches from Chamkani in the east end to Karkhano market. A BRT was originally planned to use a fleet of 255 buses of which 155 will be 12 meter-long buses, while 65 will be 18 meter-long articulated buses.

BRT is made for this aims to combine the capacity and speed of a metro with the flexibility, lower cost and

Simplicity of a bus system. It is made for reduced travel time for users of public transport, safe and more comfortable means of travel, More friendly means of travel for women and children, enhance the city outlook and reputation.
