Answer:-

→ MEANING OF ZAKAT:-

Zakat basically has two very main meanings. The first one is To clean and the second one is To make it pure.

It means that how one can remove impediments and help it grow more and be more developed.

Zakat is the key element of our faith in Islam. Zakat is basically an complete

act of worship which is mandatory to every muslim to perform so that those unprivileged muslims can be helped. Zakat is paid so that the wealth can be purified. Every year muslims pay the right amount of Zakat i.e. (2.5%) of your wealth.

→ OBJECTIVES OF ZAKAT:-

* **TAUHID:-**
