➤      **Abstract**  
**Defination**

An **Abstract** is a summary of the whole **technical report**. It's sometimes called the 'Summary' or the 'Executive Summary'. It comes right at the beginning of a **report**, on its own page, and usually after the Title page. Because the **Abstract** is a summary of the whole **report**, it's also the last thing you will **write**.

➤      **CONCLUSION**  
**Defination**

A "true" conclusion is a logical thing. For example, in the body of a report, you might present conflicting theories and explored the related data. Or you might have compared different models and brands of some product. In the conclusion, the

"true" conclusion, you'd present your interpretation, your choice of the best model or brand--your final conclusions.

➤ **Differentiate between abstract and conclusion :**

Abstract is in fact, not the part of an essay. It just describe the theme of writing an essay or piece of writing in contrast to summary that is different with abstract just in this sense, that it includes all the important parts of a detailed essay. By reading a summary, a person has no need to read all the detailed essay, while by reading abstract, a person cannot think about content of essay. Similarly, introduction is preliminary part of a piece of writing that disclose the area of discussion that is going to be discussed in that essay. However, conclusion is just the final verdict of an essay.
