Allah.

Q-2 Write Prime categories of prayers and what is the difference between nafilat and wajib prayers?

Ans: We have the following prime categories of prayers:-

1. Fard Prayer:-

Fard prayers are compulsory for Muslims. If a hard prayer is missed for some reason, it should be made up later.

The reward for praying Fard prayers in congregation is more than for praying alone.

2- Wajib prayer:-

This is also an obligatory prayer. It has lesser importance than the Fard prayer.

The witr prayer (offered during the isha prayer)

is a wajib prayer.

3. Sunnah prayers:-

It was the Holy practice of the prophet Muhammad (PBUH). Allah did not committed to perform these prayers.

4. Nafil prayers:-

Nafil prayers are optional or voluntary prayers.

One can offer nafil prayers developing on one's will.

Difference between nafil and wajib prayer:-

There is a huge difference between nafil and wajib prayers. Nafil prayers are optional or voluntary prayers.

On the other hand wajib prayer is an obligatory prayer with

lesser importance than the
Fard prayer.
