Accountable for five things

"Narrated Abdullah Bin Mas'ud Allah's Messenger (S.A.W) said:
"A man shall be asked concerning five things on the day of
resurrection: concerning his life, how he spent it; concerning his
youth, how he grew old; concerning his wealth, whence he
acquired it, and in what way he spent it; and what was it that he did
with the knowledge that he had."

Explanation: The most important events that will happen on the Day of Judgement are when we will be held accountable for our deeds and when we will be questioned by Allah. There are many Qur'anic verses and ahadith that tell us about these events so that the believers will prepare themselves for the most important, final test.
